

The Gettysburg Address for Sudanese Christians 2008

Eleven score and twelve years ago our Fathers brought forth on this earth, a new civilization, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all humans are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great culture war, testing whether the current dominant culture in our nation, can long endure. We are met on the great battle-field of this civilizational war, for the greatest prize and power in history, to be the Dominant Culture in the United States of America.

We have come to dedicate a portion of our nation, for those who there gave their lives, that our recovered Judeo-Christian culture might live, free of Negligent Genocide from animus towards Christians and indifference to Black People. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate – we can not consecrate – we can not hallow – this ground. The brave Christian families of the Killing Fields of Sudan, where 4,000,000 of our people have been slain, over half the numbers of the Holocaust, who struggled there, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract.

The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget how they died there. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here, to the unfinished work which they who fought there have thus far so nobly advanced.

It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us – that from these millions of honored dead we take increased devotion – that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain – that our civilization, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom – and that a civilization of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.
